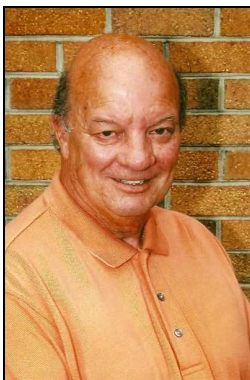
"This is an old but great photo of my Dad when he had hair. He used to cross the old bridge many times each day in his long truck."

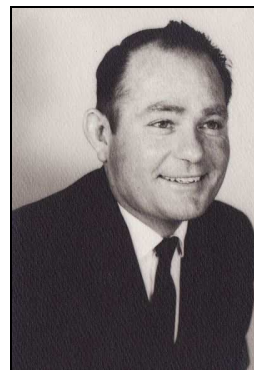
